REPORTS:

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING SUPERVISOR

Mrs. Dolan summarized points from her report. She reported on Flu activity, lead testing and Immunization Audits. She gave updates on communicable disease monitoring and reporting. Specifically mentioned were Measles and Legionellosis. Mrs. Dolan also pointed out that tick surveillance has increased by the NJDOH who are working directly with mosquito commissions in each county to identify and treat breeding sources. Mr. Fitzpatrick spoke at this time regarding the Influenza Honor Roll recognition of the Madison Health Department with top honors for their flu immunization initiative flu season 2018-19.

HEALTH OFFICER:

Mr. Fitzpatrick advised the board of the progress of Ossinio's Market on Main Street which is looking to open in 5-6 days and feels they have been more than accommodating regarding his requirements and suggestions. As far as Atlantic Health Care, they will be turning from construction to management in mid June. All pre ops done so far. Mr. Fitzpatrick referred to the current concern in Madison regarding foxes/coyotes. He will ask inspectors to go into the area and observe for attractive nuisances that may be attracting these animals.

INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

Mr. Range opened the meeting to the public and the following spoke to the board.

Stephanie Earl, Bridgewater, NJ on behalf of Furrylicious Pet Boutique. She is taking every opportunity to educate the board regarding the pending ordinance scheduled for

adoption by the Mayor and Council amending Chapter 59 prohibiting the sale of dogs and cats in the borough. She feels there is misinformation out there about pet stores. The "adopt don't shop" mentality. She spoke about rescues many unregulated. She showed the USDA guideline requirement booklet. The USDA is making improvements to animal welfare act. She mentioned unregistered breeders. Rescues and shelters are exempt from USDA requirements. Puppies from puppy stores are protected by the pet purchase protection act, but rescues and shelters are exempt. Pet store bans are a trend right now. Not a single puppy mill has been put out of business.

Cynthia Knowles, Tewksbury, NJ, Morristown did not pass ordinance after researching. There are problem with shelters and rescues. She spoke of diseased dogs and that a broker was forging veterinary certificates. She states retail rescues are the biggest buyers at puppy mill auctions. It is all unregulated with no oversight. She owns an animal hospital in Long Valley/Whitehouse Station. She sighted an example of a rescue that had adopted out sick animals. Rescues are out of control in NJ. Her place is the only place regulated to safely get a family pet. She feels that if the issue is going to be addressed in our town, more information must be looked into.
