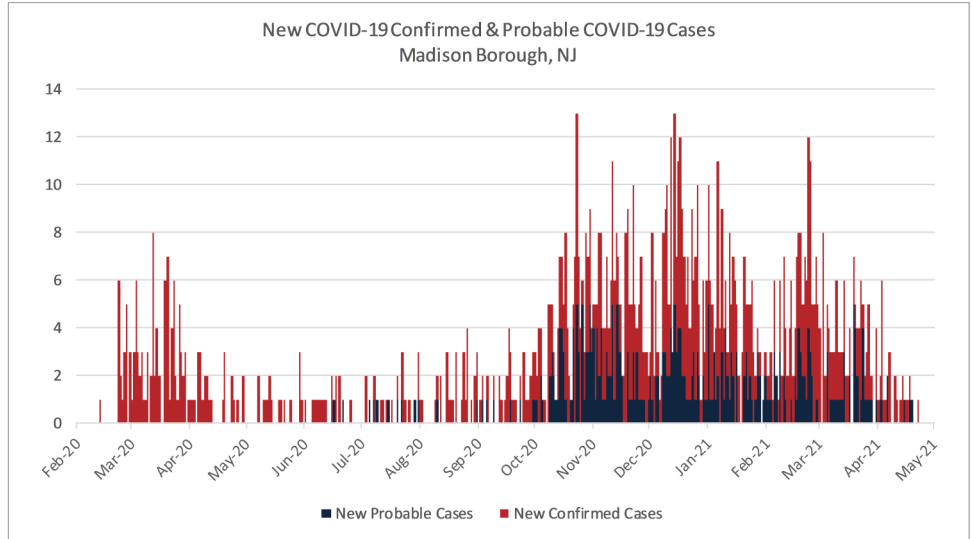

COVID-19 Update 5/19/21

Since the arrival of COVID-19 in early March 2020, there have been a total of 868 confirmed (PCR test) and 336 probable (antigen test) COVID-19 cases reported in Madison Borough*. The chart to the right shows the trend in reported cases over time, indicating that highest period of COVID-19 activity from late fall 2020 to early spring 2021. The number of new cases locally and statewide has decreased significantly; mimicking levels similar to those seen in the summer of 2020.
